

Dr. Paul W. Chilcote is Professor of Historical Theology & Wesleyan Studies and Director of the Center for Applied Wesleyan Studies at Ashland Theological Seminary in Ohio. He has been involved in theological education on three Continents, serving as a missionary, with his wife, Janet, in Kenya, and as a charter faculty member of Africa University in Zimbabwe. He has taught as well at the Methodist Theological School in Ohio and Duke Divinity School, and helped to launch the Dunnam Campus of Asbury Theological Seminary in Florida.

He is the author of fifteen books, the most recent of which include *Early Methodist Spirituality*, *The Study of Evangelism*, and *Recapturing the Wesleys' Vision*. He serves as a unit editor in *The Works of John Wesley* project, is President of The Charles Wesley Society and the Academy for Evangelism, and enjoys a special relationship with Mt. Angel Abbey in Oregon as a Benedictine Oblate. Dr. Chilcote is a frequent speaker and workshop leader in applied Wesleyan studies, particularly in the areas of spirituality, worship, discipleship, and evangelism.
